website. On January 15, 1962 (the numerical date of our last meeting), President Kennedy was asked at a news conference if U.S. troops were fighting in Vietnam and he answered "No". Technically, he was correct, but U.S. soldiers were serving as advisors with the South Vietnamese Army, and U.S. Pilots were flying missions with the South Vietnamese Air Force. The Press was starting to ask questions because they realized there were wounded and causalities from these" support missions".

Defense Secretary McNamara saw few signs of improvement in South Vietnam and convened a conference to assess the deteriorating conditions and options. He wanted to move fast to beef up the U.S. Effort in Vietnam. McNamara concluded that a new command at operational level was needed that could achieve unity of efforts and get things moving in the right direction.

On February 8, 1962, the administration established the U.S. Military Assistance Command Vietnam (MACV), which was a unified subordinate command of the Commander in Chief of the Pacific and was assigned responsibility for all American activities in Vietnam.
